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Asiatic Registration Act—A Crooked Policy

(Continued from the Previous issue)



As soon as we landed at Cape Town, and more so when we reached Johannesburg, we saw that we had overrated the Madeira cablegram. Mr. Ritch who sent it was not responsible for this. He cabled only what he had heard about the measure being disallowed. As we have already observed, the Transvaal was then, that is to say in 1906, a Crown colony. Crown Colonies are represented in England by agents one of whose duties it is to instruct the Secretary of State for the Colonies in all matters affecting Colonial interests. The Transvaal was then represented by Sir Richard Solomon, the noted lawyer of South Africa. Lord Elgin had disallowed the Black Act in consultation with him. Responsible government was to be conferred on the Transvaal on January 1, 1907. Lord Elgin therefore assured Sir Richard that if an identical measure was passed by the Transvaal legislature constituted after the grant of responsible government, it would not be refused the royal assent. But so long as the Transvaal was a Crown Colony, the Imperial Government would be held directly responsible for such class legislation, and as racial discrimination was a departure from the fundamental principles of the British Empire, he could not but advise

His Majesty to disallow the measure in disallowed the question.

If the measure was to be thus disallowed only in name and if the Transvaal Europeans could at the same time have their own way, Sir Richard Solomon had no reason to object to such an excellent arrangement. I have characterized this as crooked policy, but I believe it could be given a still harsher name with perfect justice. The Imperial Government is directly responsible for the legislation of Crown Colonies, and there is no place in its constitution for discrimination on the ground of race or colour. So far so good. One can also understand that the Imperial Government could not all at once disallow measures passed by the legislatures of Colonies enjoying responsible government. But to hold private conferences with Colonial agents and in advance to promise the royal assent to legislation which is in open violation of the Imperial Constitution,-what is this if it is not a breach of faith and an injustice to those whose rights are thus pilfered? Really speaking Lord Elgin by his assurance encouraged the Transvaal Europeans in their anti-Indian activities. If he wanted to do this, he ought to have told the Indian deputation so in plain terms. As a matter of fact the Empire cannot escape responsibility even for the legislation of Colonies enjoying responsible government. Even such Colonies are bound to accept the fundamental principles of the British Constitution. As for example no such colony can revive the institution of

Black Act because it was an improper piece o f legislation, and he could disallow it only on this ground, it was his clean duty



warned Sir Richard Solomon that the Transvaal could not enact such an iniquitous law after the grant of responsible government, and if it had any intention of doing so, the Imperial Government would be constrained to reconsider the advisability of granting it any such superior status. Or he should have told Sir Richard that responsible government could be conferred only on the condition that the rights of the Indians were fully safeguarded. Instead of following such straightforward procedure, Lord Elgin made an outward show of friendliness to the Indians, while at the same time he really and secretly supported the Transvaal Government and encouraged it to pass once more the very law which he had vetoed himself. This is not the only or the first case of such tortuous policy followed by the British Empire. Even an indifferent student of its history will easily recall similar incidents.

Our disappointment in South Africa was as deep as had been our joy in Madeira. Yet the immediate consequence of legalized slavery. 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

Role of Roma in Strengthening Relationship with India

Centre for Roma Studies and Cultural Relations-ARSP organized a Round-Table Deliberation on the Role and Contribution of Roma Community in fostering relationship and friendship between India and their respective native countries on 5 February 2020 at Pravasi Bhavan. The discussion was graced by the participation of Ambassadors and Representatives of the diplomatic corps along with ARSP office bearers, Roma experts and other dignitaries. The deliberation broached various aspects of Roma community including socio-economic conditions, political representation, identity crisis and health-education status in the countries where there is a large concentration of Romani populations.

The theme of discussion was introduced by Zameer Anwar who said, India connection of Romani people appears axiomatic from considerable cultural and linguistic similarities and is further substantiated based on anthropological, ethnological and genetic findings. There are empirical evidences to believe that Romani language and a considerable part of core Romani culture are readily identified as the direct transmission from India.

The discussion was moderated by Sri ShyamParande, Secretary General of ARSP. In his welcome remarks, he asserted that the identity crisis and rootlessness of Roma community may be resolved through recognizing them of Indian origin that is already acceptable globally. Romani people are spread throughout the world including Brazil, Latin American countries, USA, Russia and Europe. He said, the mindset of people is to be changed and stereotyped projection of Roma is to be shed off for betterment of the community. Sri Parande further added that we wish to engage with every section of Roma community, residing anywhere in the world. Keeping in mind our limitations, we try to communicate and collaborate with Romani organizations and NGOs having democratic and wider representation of the community.

In his speech, Serbian Ambassador H.E. Vladimir Mariæ said, he has

settlements. Therefore, he knows and understands them better. H.E. Vladimir Mariæ emphasized on establishing people to people contact with Roma belonging to different spheres of life. Roma are consummate musicians, so they should be invited to participate in the musical workshops or perform at cultural festivals and that what they expect from India. Through this way the sense of Indianness will grow amongst them. Earlier, the condition of Roma in Serbia was not well off, but now things are changing, because Serbia is developing as a result the condition of Roma is improving as well. Mr. Frantisek Jirasek, Counsellor at Embassy of Czech Republic in New Delhi, shared his experiences of meeting and interacting with Romani people. Mr. Jirasek further said there is no doubt that anti Roma feeling prevailing among white people, but it is up to Roma for improving their conditions. If they want to work and send their children to school, there is no restriction.

During the Question & Answer Session, Prof. Prassannasu at National Law University remarked, crime is not something inherent or racial reason, but it is because of deprivation, therefore it is symptom that requires our help rather than accusation. Roma face discrimination in schools. As far as ethnic origin of Roma is concerned, it is not important. If Roma feel some connection with India, that is important. Such connect is eloquent in form of language and culture. Dr. S.S. Shashi talked about discrimination against Roma that is widespread as well as false projection of poor Roma as criminals and thieves is commonplace in different countries of the world. Dr. Punita Singh and Dr. Shashi Bala also raised the question of policy for their integration. They said, not only governmental policy but intention and good faith are also significant in the amicable integration of Roma community.

Balmiki Ramayan Photographic Exhibition in Trinidad and Tobago

Fifty images of the Balmiki Ramayan from the Rampur Raza Library in India are here in TT on exhibition at the Art Society, Federation Park, Port of Spain.

Each piece was translated into English for the local audience.

The Balmiki Ramayan is a centuriesold treasure of 17,000 ancient manuscripts preserved in their natural splendour.

The Persian manuscript is invaluable in its contributions as the 258 photographic images contained within it depict the art, architecture and culture of that period, according to Arun Kumar Sahu, High Commissioner of India.

Speaking at the official launch, A m b a s s a d o r Sahu told that R a m a y a n a, originally written by Valmiki, tells the story of a prince, Rama of the city of Ayodhya, and is one of the two major Sanskrit epics of ancient India, the other

being the Mahabharata and the story has been told and retold in various forms for generations in India and in several countries around the world, including TT.

He said it gave him immense pleasure to bring one of the treasures of India, an exhibition of Balmiki (Valmiki) Ramayan transliterated from Sanskrit to Persian by Sumir Chand in 1715, during the reign of Farrukhsiyar, a Mughal emperor. "The Rampur Raza Library in Rampur, Uttar Pradesh owns the original manuscript. This manuscript is in the Persian Nasta'liq script written with gold water and like other manuscripts of that period, is beautifully illustrated.

GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES PADMA AWARDS TO PIOs/Indologists of Foreigners Countries

Fourteen foreigners. majority of them of the Indian origin, including Mauritian politician Anerood Jugnauth, have been named for the Dr. Jagdish Sheth Bhushan Award

Jugnauth GCSK Padma Awards on the eve of 71st Republic Day. Jugnauth has been named for Padma Vibhushan, the second highest civilian award, in the field of public affairs. Jugnauth, who served as the President and the Prime Minister of Mauritius, was a central figure in the Mauritian politics in the 1980s and 1990s. Jagdish Sheth, based in the USA, will be receiving Padma Bhushan in the field of literature and education. Twelve foreigners have been named for Padma Shri. It included late Indra Dassanayake, a well-known Hindi literary personality who taught Hindi at the University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka. Dassanayake strived for emergence of Hindi as a world language. Another awardee is Barry Strachan Gardiner, British Labour Party leader who has served as Shadow Secretary of State for International Trade since 2016. Another notable foreign personality in the list is late Tetsu Nakamura for his social work in Afghanistan. A Japanese physician and honorary Afghan, Nakamura headed the Peace Japan Medical Services (PMS). Devoted to the Kunar river canal projects in eastern Afghanistan, he was credited for transforming the desert of Gamberi, on the outskirts of Jalalabad, into a lush forest and wheat farmlands. He also helped build two hospitals and two mosques. The Padma Awards are given in three categories - Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri - in various fields of activities like art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, civil service. भारतीय उपमहाद्वीप और दक्षिण-पूर्व एशिया

में शाश्यत शंश्कृति के निशान

नज्र डालें तो उसके अत्यंत विशाल और दैवी स्वरूप के दर्शन होते हैं। भारतवर्ष की कल्पना एक जीवंत सत्व की तरह की गई है। उस समय के भारतवर्ष का वैदिक समाज पर्वत को पिता और नदी को पयस्विनी (दूध पिलाने वाली) माँ कहकर संबोधित करता है। भारतवर्ष की उत्तरी सीमा में कैलाश शिखर के रूप में बर्फ की सफेद भरम रमाए अचल योगी की तरह परम-पिता शिव विराजमान हैं। भगवान शिव के हृदय–सिंधू से लिपटी माँ पार्वती (पर्वत से प्रवाहित जलराशि) का जीवनदायी विस्तार नीचे के पश्चिमी और पूर्वी सागर पर्यंन्त सारे अंचल में है। पार्वती की दो बाँहों में पांच-पांच उंगलियों की तरह दो पंचनद प्रदेश हैं। पश्चिमी पंचनद प्रदेश में सिंधु (सिन्ध), वितस्ता (झेलम), अस्क्नी (चंद्रभागा या चिनाव), परूष्णी (ऐरावती या रावी) और विपाशा-शतद्र (व्यास-सतलज) दक्षिण-पश्चिमी अंचल को सिक्त करते हुए एक साथ पश्चिम सागर (अरब सागर) में मिलती हैं। पूर्वी पंचनद प्रदेश में यमुना, गंगा, गोमती, शर्यु (सरयू या घाघरा) और सदानीरा (गंडक) नदियाँ हैं जो दक्षिण-पूर्वी अंचल को अपनी ममता से सींचते हुए एक साथ पूर्वी सागर (हिंद महासागर) में मिलती हैं।

भगवान शिव के चरणों में कैलाश की घाटियों से होते हुए पर्वत—खंडों से टकराती उग्र श्यामला काली का विस्तार है जो आगे दक्षिणी मैदानों में शांत सुरम्य शारदा में विलीन हो जाती है। शारदा अपने पूर्वी विस्तार में मैदानों में उतर कर शर्यू से जा मिलती है।

इन दोनों पंचनद बाँहों के मध्य में माँ पार्वती के हृदय भाग में सरस्वती और दृषद्वती दो पयस्विनी धाराएँ

आज से लगभग सात हज़ार वर्ष पूर्व के भारतवर्ष पर प्रवाहित हैं। इन दोनों के बीच का सुपोषित अंचल है अद्भुत संगीतमय कलरव सुनाई देता है, इसलिए ब्रह्मावर्त, जिसे वैवस्वत मनु ने समृद्ध किया था। उत्तर काल में पूर्वी पंचनद प्रदेश में आर्यावर्त का विस्तार हुआ।

> लगभग 1 5 हज़ार वर्ष पूर्व हिमयूग के अंतिम दौर में मनु के पूर्वज आर्याणाम (वर्तमान ईरान) और उसके पश्चिमी अंचल (वर्तमान फ़ारस की खाड़ी के पूर्वी तटीय प्रदेश) में निवास करते थे। सहस्रों वर्षों में आर्य जनों ने वर्तमान अफ्रीका, लाल सागर के तटीय प्रदेश, वर्तमान अरब देश आदि की यात्राएं करते हुए फारस की खाड़ी और आर्याणाम के इस अंचल की यात्राएं की थीं। जब हिमयुग बीता तो सागर का जलस्तर तेज़ी से बढ़ा जिससे महाजलप्लावन में वह फारस की खाड़ी का सारा तटीय अंचल डूब गया और मनु अपने समाज के कुछ लोगों के साथ किसी तरह बच कर पूर्व दिशा में चलते हुए जंबू द्वीप के इस सरस्वती-दृषद्वती के बीच की सुंदर शांत सुपोषित भूमि पर आए और उन्होंने यहां ब्रह्मावर्त की सारस्वत सभ्यता और संस्कृति की स्थापना की। उनकी संतान मानव इक्ष्वाकु ने इसका पूर्वी पंचनद प्रदेशों तक विस्तार किया। उत्तर काल में दक्षिण के द्वीपीय अंचलों से होते हुए यह विस्तार सुदुर ताम्रपणी (वर्तमान श्रीलंका), स्वर्णद्वीप (वर्तमान सुमात्रा), यवद्वीप (वर्तमान जावा), चंपा द्वीप(वर्तमान वियतनाम) अदि में और इस प्रकार पूरे कंबोज द्वीप (वर्तमान कबोडिया) में और उत्तर के पूर्वी-यूरोपीय अंचलों में सघन रूप से फ़ैल गया।

> सरस्वती भारतवर्ष का हृदय-हार है। वसंत आते-आते जब जल-धारा की काटने वाली ठंडी धार नर्म हो जाती है, इसके तटों पर हंसों की पाँत का

यह हसवाहिनी है। इसका कल-कल निनाद एक सुमधुर संगीत की तरह सुनाई पड़ता है इसलिए यह वीणावादिनी है। इसके तटों पर सैकड़ों वर्षों से आर्ष मनीषियों के नानाविध ज्ञान-अनुसंधान के अनेकानेक केंद्र विकसित हो रहे हैं, इसलिए यह ज्ञान, कला और संगीत की देवी है। शीत ऋतु के बाद वसंत के आगमन पर ब्रह्मावर्त के तटीय निवासी स्त्री-पुरूष पीले उत्तरीय धारण कर इसके जल में पुष्पराशि अर्पित करते हैं और प्रार्थना के स्वर में गा उटते हैं–

अम्बितमे नदीतमे देवितमे सरस्वति। अप्रशस्ताइव रमसि प्रशस्तिमम्ब नस्कृधि।(ऋग्वेद 2.41.16)

ओ माँ सरस्वती! तुम माताओं में सर्वश्रेष्ठ, नदियों में सर्वश्रेष्ठ, देवियों में सर्वश्रेष्ठ हो। यद्यपि हम तुम्हारे योग्य नहीं, फिर भी हे कृपालु माँ, तुम हमें श्रेष्ठता प्रदान करो।

कालांतर में, इस अंचल के बीच की उन्नत भूमि (अरावली श्रृंखला की उठानों) के दोनों ओर बँट कर सरस्वती की पावन जलराशि पश्चिम में शतद्र और पूर्व में यमुना और गंगा की धाराओं में विलीन हो गई और इस प्रकार यह आज भी इन जलराशियों में घुल-मिलकर पूरे भारतवर्ष के कण-कण को जीवन से सींच रही है।

इस पूरे भारतीय उपमहाद्वीप, दक्षिण-पूर्व एशिया और पूर्वी यूरोप के देशों में इस सारस्वत संस्कृति के भूगभीय, पुरातात्विक, साहित्यिक और समाज-सांस्कृतिक साक्ष्य बिखरे हुए मिलते हैं।

16 साल की उम्र में औरंगाबाद के विनीत ने एक <mark>ऐसा आविष्कार किया है, जिससे देश ही नहीं, बल्कि</mark> दुसरें देशों का भी ध्यान उनकी ओर आकर्षित हुआ है। शहर के सच्चिदांनद सिन्हा कॉलेज के इंटर साइंस में पढ़ने वाले औरंगाबाद प्रखंड के देवहरा गांव निवासी धनेश प्रजापति व सुनीता देवी के पुत्र विनीत कुमार ने प्लास्टिक से पेट्रोल, एलपीजी व <mark>टाइल्स बनाने की तरकीब निकाली है।</mark> फिलहाल वे <mark>बेकार पड़े प्लास्टिक से पेट्रोल व एलपी</mark>जी बना रहे हैं। विनीत ने बताया कि एक किलो प्लास्टिक से 800 ग्राम पेट्रोल, 200 ग्राम एलपीजी तैयार होती है और जो अवशेष बच जाता है, उससे टाइल्स <mark>बनता हैं।वह अपने इस आविष्कार को बड़ा रूप देना</mark>

सबसे पहले प्लास्टिक को जमा कर उसे उच्च नाइट्रोजन से पास किया जाता है। जिसके बाद वह



तापमान पर रसायन की मदद से गलाया जाता है। जहां प्लास्टिक गलता है, वहां ऑक्सीजन की मात्रा न के बराबर होती है। प्लास्टिक गलने के बाद गैस के रूप में परिवर्तित हो जाता है। फिर मशीन के अंदर गैस के साथ केटेलाइटिक रिडक्शन की प्रक्रिया होती है। उत्प्रेरक के साथ गैस को रिएक्ट कराकर हाई लिक्विड में बदल जाता है। इसके बाद ये इथेन बन जाता है, जिससे पेट्रोल व डीजल तैयार होता है। जो पेट्रोल नहीं बन पाता, उसे एलपीजी के रूप में प्राप्त किया जाता है। अवशेष के रूप में मिलने वाले फ्लाई ऐश से टाइल्स व ईंटें बनती हैं।

विनीत को कई देशों ने सम्मानित किया है।हैदराबाद में हुए इंटरनेशनल इनोवेटिव फेयर में दुनिया के 30 देशों ने भाग लिया था। विनीत ने बिहार का नेतृत्व किया था। इन देशों के वैज्ञानिक विनीत की प्रतिभा देखकर दंग रह गये। इनमें से छह देश पोलैंड, चाइना, पुर्तगाल, क्रोएशिया, ब्राजील व साउथ अफ्रीका ने उन्हें अपने यहां रिसर्च के लिए आमंत्रित किया है। यूरोप, पूर्तगाल जैसे देशों ने उन्हें बेस्ट इनोवेटर का पुरस्कार दिया है। पीएमओ व इसरों ने भी विनीत की सराहना की है।

अंकोश्वाट-कम्बुज देश का राष्ट्र मंदिर


सूर्यवर्मन द्वितीय ने भगवान विष्णु को समर्पित अकोरवाट नामक मन्दिर की स्थापना राष्ट्र मन्दिर के रूप में की थी। आज यह अंकोरवाट मन्दिर कम्बुज देश की अस्मिता है। विश्व में केवल अंकोरवाट ऐसा मन्दिर है जो किसी देश के राष्ट्रीय ध्वज में विराजमान है। अर्ध शताब्दी पूर्व जब मेरे पिताजी ने अंकोरवाट के चित्र दिखाए और बताया कि यह संसार का सबसे बड़ा विष्णु मन्दिर है जो कंबोडिया में स्थित है, और आज मानव और प्रकृति दोनों कारणों से यह जीर्ण-शीर्ण अवस्था में है तो मन में एक ही प्रश्न उठा कि कब इसमें श्रद्धा के दीप जलेंगे। आज वह दिन आ गया है। हृदय हर्ष एवं भाव से विभोर हो उठा है भारत और कंबोडिया के संबंधों में एक नया इतिहास अंकित होने जा रहा है। धन्य हैं वे सभी जो यह पुण्य कार्य करने में जुटे हुए हैं।

अंकोरवाट विश्व का सबसे बड़ा विष्णु मन्दिर था जहां से शेषषायी भगवान विष्णु की विशाल मूर्ति के खंड प्राप्त हुए हैं। इस मन्दिर से प्राप्त संस्कृत के शिलालेखों से उसका इतिहास ज्ञात होता है। मन्दिर की दीवारों पर रामायण और महाभारत के कथानक उत्कीर्ण हैं। यह वहीं अंकोरवाट मन्दिर है जिसमें 49 मीटर लंबा महाभारत के युद्ध का दृश्य अंकित है।

अंकोरवाट का यह मन्दिर एक वर्ग किलोमीटर में निर्मित है। इसके चारों ओर एक तड़ाग बनाया गया था क्योंकि इस मन्दिर में जाने का अर्थ है विष्णु लोक में जाना, विष्णु लोक में जाने के लिए भवसागर को पार करना आवश्यक है। उसी दर्शन के आधार पर इस तड़ाग का निर्माण किया गया था, परंतु आज यहां का जल सूख चुका है।

कम्बुज देश के साथ हमारे संबंधों का इतिहास दूसरी शताब्दी में आरंभ हो जाता है। ग्यारहवीं और बारहवीं शताब्दी के आते-आते कम्बुज देश भारत-मय हो गया था। जब वहां भारतीय लोग गए तो सबसे पहले उन्होंने भारतीय लिपि के आधार पर कम्बुज लिपि का निर्माण किया। एक नई लिपि का निर्माण होते ही एक नवीन पथ उद्घाटित हुआ। कम्बुज लोगों ने लिखना और पढ़ना आरम्भ किया। इसका प्रमाण हमें स्थान-स्थान पर उपलब्ध हुए 12000 से अधिक संस्कृत के शिलालेखों से होता है। यहां के राजाओं ने अपनी राज्य व्यवस्था को भारतीय धर्म आधारित नियमों से सुदृढ़ किया। अपने महान कार्यों को शिलालेखों पर उत्कीर्ण किया। एक ओर वे अपनी विजय यात्राओं की रामायण और महाभारत से तुलना कर उन्हें मन्दिरों की भित्तियों पर उत्कीर्ण कर शाश्वत करते रहे तो दूसरी ओर अपने स्वर्णिम इतिहास को संस्कृत भाषा में लिखते रहे। भव्य मन्दिरों का निर्माण कर स्वंय को धन्य मानते रहे। जब किसी राजा का राज्याभिषेक होता था तो राज्याभिषेक के हेतु से एक भव्य मन्दिर का निर्माण किया जाता था, उसमें उस देवता की प्रतिमा की स्थापना होती थी जिसका वह राजा भक्त होता था और अंत में उसके मरणोपरांत उसी मन्दिर में उस राजा की उसी देवता के रूप में मूर्ति स्थापित कर दी जाती थी।

आज इन मन्दिरों से बड़ी संख्या में मूर्तियां उपलब्ध हुई हैं। जो इनकी श्रद्धा के प्रतीक स्वरूप हमारे समक्ष खड़ी



है। बारहवीं और तेरहवीं शताब्दी के लगभग संपूर्ण दक्षिण पूर्व एशिया में विष्णु भक्ति जन-जन के हृदय में स्थान बना चुकी थी। एक राज के लिए विष्णु से बड़ा कोई आदर्श नहीं हो सकता। अतः वहां के राजा विष्णू के अवतार के रूप में राज्य करते रहे। कम्बुज के शिलालेख इन सभी राजाओं की कथा सुनाते हैं। एक शिलालेख में स्पष्ट वर्णन मिलता है कि मन्दिरों में पाठ हेतू भारत से रामायण, महाभारत एवं पूराण मंगवाए जाते थे। इन ग्रंथों के स्वर शताब्दियों तक भव्य मन्दिरों में गुंजायमान होते रहे। इन महाकाव्यों से लिए गए कथानक एक ओर ऐतिहासिक घटनाओं के प्रतिमान बने रहे तो दूसरी ओर मन्दिर आने वाले राजा और राज-परिवारो तथा श्रद्धालुओं के लिए जीवन में उच्च आदर्शों का पालन करने हेतु प्रेरणा के स्रोत बने रहे। अंकोरवाट मन्दिर भगवान विष्णु का बैकुंठ धाम है। अतः इसका निर्माण मानव निर्मित सुमेरू पर्वत पर किया गया। राजा सूर्यवर्मन द्वितीय को मरणोपरांत विष्णु लोक में स्थान मिला। उनकी मूर्ति भगवान विष्णु रूप में स्थापित की गई। इसी में उनका राज्याभिषेक हुआ था। वे सारा जीवन विष्णु भगवान के आदर्शों से प्रेरणा प्राप्त राष्ट्र की उन्नति के कार्यों में जुटे रहे।

विश्व में केवल कम्बुज ही एक ऐसा देश है जहां चौदहवीं शताब्दी तक संस्कृत राजभाषा के रूप में प्रयुक्त होती रही। संस्कृत ने कम्बुज भाषा को प्राणवायु दी। उसे भावाभिव्यक्ति के उच्च स्तर तक पहुंचा दिया। आज तक भी उनकी भाषा में लगभग 60 प्रतिशत शब्द संस्कृत की देन हैं। उदाहरण के लिए कहा जाए तो वे आज भी महीनों के नाम चैत्र, वैशाख आदि प्रयुक्त करते हैं। जब वहां से उपलब्ध 1200 से अधिक संस्कृत के शिलालेखों में लिखित राजाओं के सब सत्कर्मों के विवरण पढ़ते हैं तो ज्ञात होता है कि वहां के लोग कितनी सुललित एवं उच्च स्तर की संस्कृत लिखने की योग्यता रखते थे। इन कृतियों में अनेक प्रकार के छंद प्रयोग किए गए हैं, जैसे-वसन्ततिलका, शार्दूल, मालिनी आदि। वहां के राजाओं ने बड़े गर्व से भारतीय नाम धारण किए, जैसे–सूर्यवर्मन, इंद्रवर्मन, ईशानवर्मन, राजेन्द्रवर्मन आदि। यह परंपरा शताब्दियों तक चलती रही, उन्होंने अपने नगरों के नाम यशोधरपुर, ताम्रपुर, ध्रुवपुर, विक्रमपरु आदि रखे।

मन्दिरों के साथ ब्राह्मणों के लिए आश्रम बनवाए गए। यहां के राजा हिन्दु राज्य व्यवस्था के अनुसार राज्य चलाते रहे। इनमें मनुस्मृति का सबसे बड़ा स्थान है। एक शिलालेख में पता चलता है कि उन्होंने भारत से मनुस्मृति भी मंगवाई थी। मेरे अनुसंधान के अनुसार अंकोरवाट को दार्शनिक आधार देने वाला ग्रंथ मनुस्मृति ही है। अंकोरवाट जिस नगर में स्थापित है उस नगर का प्राचीन नाम था अंकोर अर्थात नगर अर्थात राष्ट्रीय राजधानी जिसकी अस्मिता अंकोरवाट में स्थापित हुई। पन्द्रहवीं शताब्दी में थाई

आक्रमण के उपरात यह अंतराष्ट्रिय सहयोग परिषद मन्दिर व इसके चारों ओर का स्थान, यह नगर सभी कुछ निर्जन हो गए, विस्मृति के गर्भ में लीन हो गए, इन्हें प्रकृति के भरोसे छोड़ दिया गया। अंकोरवाट 1860 तक शांत खड़ा रहा। अचानक हेनरी मूहो नामक एक प्रकृति प्रेमी फ्रांसीसी को इसके शिखरों ने निमंत्रण दे डाला। वन में खड़े विशालकाय वृक्षों की जड़ें लगभग 4 शताब्दियों से इसे समूल उखाड़ने में समर्थ होती रहीं। अंकोरवाट तथा उसके आसपास बने भव्य मन्दिरों की खोज ने विश्व को आश्चर्यचिकत कर डाला। एक गौरवमय इतिहास उद्घाटित होने लगा, विद्वान और पुरातत्ववेत्ता इस विषय पर कार्य करने लगे। अंकोरवाट के हर कोने से, चारों ओर भारतीय धर्म, दर्शन, कला, राज्य व्यवस्था तथा सामाजिकता आदि के दर्शन होने लगे। कहीं कंबोडिया के राजा स्वंय की भगवान कृष्ण से तुलना करने लगे। इस हेतू से नंद ग्राम की रक्षा करते सभी मित्रों व ग्वालों के सहयोग से गोवर्धन पर्वत उठाते भगवान कृष्ण की मूर्तियां उत्कीर्ण की गई। कृष्ण रूप में विष्णु महाभारत के समय पांडवों की सहायता हेतु अवतरित हुए। अतः महाभारत युद्ध उनके लिए एक आदर्श बन गया। महाभारत युद्ध के दृश्य का विश्व का सबसे बड़ा 49 मीटर लंबा पैनल आज कम्बुज लोगों की शूरता और वीरता से परिपूर्ण राष्ट्रीयता के स्मारक रूप में खड़ा है। अंकोरवाट के उत्कीर्ण चित्रों में कहीं बाली सुग्रीव युद्ध है तो कहीं राम विभीषण का मिलन, कहीं राम रावण युद्ध है, तो कहीं देवी सीता की अग्नि परीक्षा, कहीं गरूड़ वाहन विष्णु तो कहीं समुद्र मंथन से रत्न निकालते देव और असुर, कहीं कैलाश उत्तोलन करता रावण तो कहीं बाणासुर का वध करते भीम। चहुं ओर सशक्त राष्ट्र अपनी सैन्य शक्ति के साथ चरम उत्कर्ष प्राप्त करता दिखाई देता है। यह अंकोरवाट का भव्य मन्दिर कम्बुज लोगों के लिए केवल धर्म का स्थान हीं नहीं था, यहां धर्मीदय के साथ-साथ राष्ट्रोदय और ज्ञानोदय भी सतत् चलता रहा। अंकोरवाट में खड़ी लगभग 16 से अधिक मूर्तियां, जिन्हें अप्सराएं माना गया है, वे निरंतर इतिहासकारों के लिए अनुसंधान का विषय बनी हुई हैं। इनकी वेशभूषा, आभूषण और मुकुटों से उनकी सामाजिक स्थिति का अनुमान अनायास ही लग जाता है। इनमें कोई अप्सराएं हैं तो कोई प्रवेश–द्वारों के दोनों ओर खड़ी हैं, कोई नृत्य भंगिमा में हैं तो कोई आनंद की अनुभूति में। उनके मुखों से अलग–अलग प्रकार की जातियों का अनुमान भी हो जाता है। सूर्यवर्मन द्वितीय अपने जीवन के 50 वर्ष तक युद्धों में जुटे रहे और एक सशक्त राष्ट्र को स्थापित करने में सफल हुए। 1 9 8 0 के दशक में हमारे शासन का इस ओर ध्यान आकर्षित हुआ तो उन्होंने अंकोरवाट के जीर्णोद्धार में एक महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई। आज पुनः देश में इस दिशा में अभूतपूर्व कार्य किया जा रहा है जो भारत और कम्बुज के संबंधों में नींवशिला का कार्य करेगा।

डॉ. इमरे बंघा ने 21वीं सदी में यूरोप में हिन्दी-शिक्षण की चुनौतियां विषय पर वक्तव्य देते हुए कहा कि 'ब्रिटेन और हिन्दी का गहरा ऐतिहासिक संबंध है, फिर भी हिन्दी की पढ़ाई के इतिहास के बारे में हमें कम जानकारी मिलती है। उपनिवेशी प्रशासन के लिए ब्रिटेन में हिन्दुस्तानी भाषा जरूर पढ़ाई जाती थी, लेकिन उस समय जानकारी बहुत कम है।' उन्होंने यह भी कहा कि 'हिन्दी सीखने से रोजगार न भी मिलें, फिर भी भाषा का साहित्य जैसा महत्व होता है ही। शिक्षकों को यहां स्पष्ट करना चाहिए कि भाषा सीखने से कोई समय बरबाद नहीं करता, बल्कि अपनी मानवता की भावना को विस्तार करता है और दूसरे देशों में परस्पर सम्मान व समझौता को बढ़ावा देता है। जो लोग कई भाषाओं में साहित्य पढ़ते हैं उनको मालूम है कि हरेक भाषा का रस अलग है और हरेक भाषा का व्यक्तित्व अलग है। यह हमारा दायित्व है कि भविष्य में हमारे बच्चे भी इन रसों और भावनाओं का आस्वादन कर सकें।

भारत के उच्चायुक्त महामहिम श्री तन्मय लाल ने इस अवसर पर भारत गणराज्य के प्रधानमंत्री, महामहिम श्री नरेंद्र मोदी का संदेश पढकर सुनाया। अपने उद्बोधन में महामहिम ने सभी को विश्व हिन्दी दिवस 2020 की शुभकामनाएं देते हुए कहा कि 'हिन्दी विश्व में सर्वाधिक बोली जाने वाली भाषाओं में से एक है। हिन्दी आज भारत, मॉरीशस तथा कुछ अन्य देशों में ही सीमित नहीं है, बल्कि हिन्दी भाषी लोग दुनिया भर के देशों में बसे हैं या कार्यरत हैं। आज विश्व में लगभग तिहत्तर देशों में, 300 संस्थानों में हिन्दी की व्यवस्था है। संयुक्त राष्ट्रसंघ द्वारा भी हिन्दी के प्रयोग को बढ़ावा दिया जा रहा है। उनके द्वारा सोशल मीडिया पर हिन्दी में पोस्ट और हिन्दी में समाचार बुलेटिन का प्रसारण गत वर्ष से आरम्भ हुआ है। विश्व हिन्दी सचिवालय भारत और मॉरीशस के अत्यंत घनिष्ठ संबंधों का प्रतीक तो है ही, यह कई मायनों में एक अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय संस्थान जैसा है, जो हिन्दी भाषा के प्रचार की दिशा में

हूँ कि विश्व में हिन्दी की कीर्ति सभी दिशाओं में फैले । महत्वपूर्ण काम कर रहा है । यह सचिवालय हिन्दी हिन्दी के सेवकों की मेहनत दुगुना फल लाए और भाषा की हमारी साझी धरोहर को सुरक्षित रखने और उसे बढ़ावा देने में महत्वपूर्ण योगदान दे रहा है।'
