# International Roma Conference

### Linquistic, Cultural and Genetic evidences ESTABLISH THE INDIAN ROOTS OF ROMA

Antar Rashtriya Sahayog Parishad (ARSP), in collaboration with National Museum- New Delhi and with the support of Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), organized a two day International Roma Conference to Commemorate the Millennium of Migration of Roma from India, on 29-30 November at the National Museum- New Delhi. The event was graced by the participation of as many as 30 Roma scholars and activists representing 20 countries from around the globe. Several experts and scholars from India also took part in this conference. Major focus of the deliberation was on the historical, linguistic and cultural connection of Roma with their homeland, India.

In his inaugural address, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, President- ICCR, said that holding of such conferences is extremely important, as it gives us an opportunity to understand Roma and study their commonalities with India. He maintained that Roma are the people who do not know the borders; therefore, they are the true followers of the Indian Philosophy of Vasudhaiva Kutumbkam (meaning the world is one family). He also opined that the Roma community is nature worshiper, and thus, subscribes to the Indian wisdom of "Saffron thinking-green living".

Roma; that on the one hand, they have achieved international fame in various fields; and on the other hand, they have suffered discrimination and persecutions. The unease and insensitivity with which they are treated in their respective countries is a matter of great concern. Dr. Gopal put forward various hypotheses about the Roma migration from India, and spoke at length about the linguistic, cultural and genetic evidences that have established the Indian roots of the Roma community. Amb. Virendra Gupta, President-ARSP, said that despite the hardships, Roma people have kept their connection with India alive. He stressed the need to create awareness among Indians about Roma. He also mentioned that ARSP with the support of ICCR had established a Centre for Roma Studies and Cultural Relations for conducting research on Roma and to promote cultural exchanges with them. Dr. Bajram Haliti spoke about the constitutional-legal status of Roma and their integration into the EU. Prof Prasannanshu claimed that Roma is nothing but extended Indian diaspora. Rajesh Ghogna spoke about the poverty, life expectancy and literacy conditions of Roma in various part of connection. world.

### Key recommendations of the International Roma Conference Held AT NEW Delhi from 29 - 30 November, 2018

- In view of the conclusive evidence with regard to Roma having originated from India, it was imperative for Roma to be formally recognized by the Government of India as People of Indian Origin (PIOs).
- Momentum of expanded outreach with Roma community achieved though two International Roma Conferences organized by ARSP to be continued-Academic Conference and Cultural Festival to be held every year alternate year. - Accordingly a Roma cultural festival to be held in India in 2019.
- 3. Award of scholarships to Roma students.
- 4. Special Cultural fellowships by ICCR for Roma students keeping in view their traditional interest in dance and music.
- 5. Training of Roma youth in IT sector under ITEC and other programmes.
- 6. Encouraging self help groups and NGOs in India to work with Roma communities overseas.
- 7. There is a large concentration of Roma communities in several countries. Our Embassies in those countries should maintain close contacts and networking with them.
- 8. Roma youth delegations to be sponsored for visit to India on the lines of KIP.
- A memorial in Kannauj in a public place to commemorate the millennium of Roma exodus from India. Separately a section, in the newly set up museum in Kannaui, to be devoted to display Roma related material.

Reckoning on the long history of cultural, historical and civilizational affinities of Roma with India. ANTAR-RASHTRIYA SAHAYOG PARISHAD has organized its second International Roma Conference from 28 November to 2 December 2018. Subsequent to the inaugural event along with two-day Academic Sessions held at National Museum in New Delhi on 29-30 November, a group of thirty two International Roma representatives and scholars from 18 different countries, consisted of Mr. Normunds RUDEVIČS, president of International Romani Union, Mr. Orhan GALjUŠ, president of Euro-Asia Roma Network, Prof. Marcel COURTHIADE, Professor of Rromani studies at INALCO in Paris, Ms. Ana Dalila de Gómez Baos, Lawyer and Author, Dr. Bajram Haliti, Ex Minister of Information and Communication in Bosnia, Dr. Marianna SESLAVINSKAYA, Culturologist, Ethnographer and specialist on Romani culture and society, journeyed to Lucknow - the capital city of Uttar Pradesh on 1st December, 2018.

Gupta, President-ARSP, who reiterated the historical connectivity of Roma with India. Shri Hriday Narayan Dikshit, Hon'ble Speaker, Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly was the chief guest and Smt. Sanyukta Bhatia, Hon'ble Mayor of Lucknow were the Guests of Honour. A number of members of parliament and legislative assembly, academicians, journalists, social activists and students were present in the programme which began with lighting of lamp and wonderful classical dance performance. After presentation of bouquets to the dignitaries, the light on the migration of Roma from Kannauj was cast by Dr. Bajram Haliti and Prof. Marcel COURTHIADE who pointed out that it took two centuries to the identification of Kannauj as the cradle city of Proto-Roms. A foray, spearheaded by sultan Mahmūd of Ghazni, was the cause of their deracination and departure from Kannauj. Hon'ble Mayor of Lucknow hosted dinner for Roma delegates and appreciated the trailblazing initiative taken by ARSP.

Center for Roma Studies & Cultural On 2nd December, the Roma Delegates paid a visit to their ancestral land -Kannauj, where they were accorded Sabhagar, University of Lucknow, UP, impressive welcome with garlanding that was presided by Amb. Virendra and Saraswati chanting at Asha Hotel.

Showering rose petals on them, they were warmly received by people of Kannauj.

This trip created an incredibly immersive experience and a sense of belonging to their ancestral homeland.

The delegates visited the archaeological museum of Kannauj that put on an exhibition; showcasing Romani historical paintings as well as arranged a laser light show for them, giving an account of historical heritage and cultural richness of Kannauj.

The delegates pilgrimaged Ancient Kali Temple where they performed Pooja with Shri Ramesh Tiwari Viram, followed by their visitation to Fragrance & Flavour Development Centre under the guidance of Shri Shakti Vinay Shukla -Director of F.F. Department, where delegates saw Herbal Garden and caught on to samples of various essential oils and flavours.

Subsequently, the Roma delegates attended the interactive session, organized by Center for Roma Studies & Cultural Relations (ARSP), on the theme of millennium of migration of Roma from Kannauj. The session was presided over by Amb. Virendra Gupta who talked about historical link of Roma with Kannauj and coming back to their roots after a millennium. The chief guest was Shri Ramesh Tiwari Viram and guests of honor were Mr. Normund Rudevics, Dr. Bairam Haliti and Shri Ravindra Kumar. The partnership between India and the United States (US) is of enormous significance and play a critical role in determining the 21st century international system. The Indian Diaspora in America, which is becoming increasingly influential, has the potential to reorient and reshape the bilateral relationship in an unprecedented way. In the light of this, the seminar explored and examined the role of the Diasporaas a catalyst in the US-India relations.

The Inaugural session with Ambassador Virendra Gupta, President ARSP as the chair, included Prof Ashwin Mahapatra, Shri Shyam Parande, Secretary General ARSP along with the chief guest Shri Sunil Ambekar. Dr Manan Dwivedi explained the objective behind the seminar while Ambassador VirendraGupta pointed out that the US and its ways were politically and diplomatically divergent from India yet, the relationship has progressed in all the conjoined spheres of military, economic and strategic partnership. Shyam Parande briefly described the mandate of ARSP along with the impact of the 'Diasporic moment' on the Prof. Ashwini contextualized and "Bilaterals" and stressed that the 3 million Indian Diaspora in the US are the most vibrant Diaspora in the world and upwardly mobile right from working at gas stations to working as top notch executives in the Silicon valley. 

The concluding part of the event was a workshop on 'Connect India' by Vision India Foundation. Shobbit Mathur and his team started off the workshop by introducing what various programs they conduct and how would the VIF assist them in the various fields.

#### Our Decisions in Govt Reflect Our Cultural Sensitivity: ICCR Chief

Since he took charge as ICCR chairman Vinay Sahasrabuddhe has worked to highlight Indian icons and ethos he feels have not been portrayed adequately and is working on a comprehensive vision document. He speaks to TOI's Akhilesh Kumar Singh about the political hues of the project as well as the need to make India's soft power count for more than it does. Excerpts:





Vinay Sahasrabuddhe

The organisation is very vital so far as our soft power is concerned. But there was confusion, lack of clarity or inertia about how to enhance our soft power. I felt it was required to revisit the vision and mission of the ICCR and now we have a fairly defined draft vision and mission statement. There is a receptivity and welcoming approach towards India. But when we talk about soft power we have to convert this goodwill into an idea of India. I find several instances when Mahatma Gandhi, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, or several of icons have not been portrayed as they should. People are putting Ganesha pictures on slippers and toilet sheets. There are mischievous elements but then it is also likely that they don't understand. So what are the elements of our soft power strategy?

There is classical dance, music, fine arts, performing arts...but we have to ensure all sections of society, regions of India, represent India. Mizo dance, Chhattisgarhi metal art, Warli paintings or some remote areas in Tamil Nadu need to be showcased. This will give our soft power a broad base because India is not just Sufi and Bharanatyam. Our diversity needs to be presented properly. In a brainstorming with Niti Aayog we considered how Indian cultural relations can strengthen out strategic and economic interests. The Khadi commission chairman told me it is doing brisk business in South Africa...then this is the time for ICCR to hold seminars on Gandhian philosophy and cottage industry. You talked about goodwill that India enjoys but what prevents adequate returns?

I think three things: academically, the presentation of India has to be far more powerful than it has been due to a Left leaning bias that India is a conglomeration of nations being held together forcibly. So there are books that Chhattisgarh is a nation, Chottanagpur is a nation. This we have to contest. In 1995, the year UN announced its International Year of Indigenous People, P V Narsimha Rao, as PM, stoutly refused to celebrate this saying in India, everybody is indigenous. We have ensure that our decisions in government reflect our cultural sensitivities. A request was made to external affairs ministry that only hand-made carpets be used in embassies as this will encourage the industry. Immediately the suggestion was accepted. There was a question whether governance and democracy is part of ICCR agenda. I said yes as we are a spiritual democracy and a political democracy. If you look at democracy ratings (Freedom House survey) where does India stand? Not where it should due to lack of awareness about the success of Indian democracy.

Barack Obama and Bill Clinton were impressed by India. It is the Modi regime that has taken leaders to cities other than Delhi.So are you also pulled into cultural battles with the Left and allegations of a right-wing revision of culture?

Naturally we have an imprint of ICCR functioning. For example we had an Indology conference and now three conferences organised in last three-four years. There was a seminar on yoga studies. But there are people who may not want it to happen, who still adhere to old outdated thinking. What Cho Ramaswamy had once said "If Left has any future in India, India has no future left" is true about views on Indian

You recently talked about "cultural antyodaya". What exactly does it mean in ICCR context?

I was giving an example of empanelment of groups and artists. There are 4,000 groups and individuals registered with ICCR. Countries used to write to us that send this group or that based mostly on their popularity. In Rajasthan we have 150 groups registered of which 127 have gone abroad in last 20 years. But in Chhattisgarh we have 15 groups but not a single group was invited. We will ensure that a more diverse selection of culture is presented abroad.

# His Holiness the 70th Je Khenpo visits Rajgir and Bodh Gaya

His Holiness the 70th Je Khenpo Trulku Jigme Choedra visited Rajgir from 9-23 November 2018. His Holiness was accompanied by Gyaltrul Rinpoche, Lopens and monks from Zhung Dratshang and senior officials of the Royal Government of Bhutan.

Coinciding with the Birth Anniversary of His Majesty the Fourth King, His Holiness the Je Khenpo presided over the ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of the Bhutanese temple at Rajgir on 11th November 2018. The foundation stone for the Bhutanese temple was laid by H.E. Shri Nitish Kumar, Chief Minister of Bihar, who was also the Chief Guest for the Event.

Speaking on the occasion Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar said "The work on the temple starts at a time when India and Bhutan are jointly celebrating the golden jubilee year of formal diplomatic relations. Its construction will further strengthen the mutual relations between the two countries." He also said that Rajgir is a very sacred place for the followers of Lord Buddha who had spent 12 years in Rajgir and delievered many of his sermons. Recalling his visit to Bhutan in May 2011, the Chief Minister said he had promised the Royal Government a plot of land in Rajgir for construction of the Bhutanese temple which he has finally fulfilled. He mentioned that the relations between the two countries draw strength from the rich and shared cultural and historical heritage and hoped that India would learn the secret of happiness from Bhutan and that people to people ties would now flourish with many more Bhutanese visiting India.

The ground-breaking ceremony was attended by Gyaltrul Rinpoche, Ambassador of Bhutan to India Major General V. Namgyel, Joint Secretary North, Ministry of External Affairs, former Indian Ambassador to Bhutan Shri Pavan K. Varma, senior officials from the Royal Government of Bhutan and the



Government of India.

As part of the Rajgir Project, a temple, hostel and guesthouse will be constructed on an area of 2.8 acres for Bhutanese pilgrims.

During the visit, His Holiness the Je Khenpo presided over a Moenlam Chhenmo (Grand World Peace Prayers) at the temple site at Rajgir, from 12 to 18 November 2018. The Grand World Peace Prayers ceremony was attended by thousands of monks, nuns and devotees from Bhutan and all over India. 

# इज्रायल का भाषायी संकल्प

वेदों में अनेक स्थलों पर संकल्प शक्ति का बखान) उन्हें कब संकलित किया गया-इस सम्बन्ध में विद्वान) शताब्दियों किया गया है। यजुर्वेद का संकल्प सूक्त तो इसका एक भण्डार ही है। संकल्प की शक्ति कैसी होती है और यदि संकल्प कर लिया जाए तो कैसे, कैसे से लेकर 81 तक है। बाइबिल से संबंधित सात ऐसी चमत्कार किए जा सकते हैं-इसी का एक उदाहरण यहां प्रस्तृत है।

इज्रायल देश से आप परिचित ही हैं, जो द्वितीय विश्व युद्ध के बाद 1948 में विश्व भर में फैले यहदियों को एक स्थान पर बसाने के लिए बनाया गया। आज वहां की मुख्य राजभाषा हिब्रू है और सहयोगी भाषाएं अंग्रेजी एवं अरबी है। अंग्रेजी और अरबी तो आज विश्व के अनेक देशों में बोली जाती है, पर हिब्रू ऐसी भाषा है जो दुनिया के नक्शे से लगभग गायब ही हो गई थी। इसके बावजूद यदि आज वह जीवित है और एक देश की राजभाषा के प्रतिष्ठित पद पर आसीन है, तो इसके पीछे एक व्यक्ति का, केवल एक व्यक्ति का, विश्वास कीजिए केवल एक व्यक्ति का संकल्प है, संघर्ष है, जुनून है, स्वाभिमान के साथ जीने की अदम्य इच्छाशक्ति है। जानना चाहेंगे कि वह एक व्यक्ति कौन था, हिब्रू कैसे नष्ट हुई और उसने उसे अपने संकल्प के बल पर पुनर्जीवित कैसे किया?

जब विश्व की प्राचीनतम भाषाओं की चर्चा होती है तो सबसे पहला नाम तो संस्कृत का लिया जाता है, क्योंकि संस्कृत में लिखा ऋग्वेद विश्व साहित्य में अब तब उपलब्ध प्राचीनतम ग्रन्थ है, पर विश्व के अन्य भागों में जो भाषाएं विकसित हुईं, उनमें एक प्राचीन भाषा है हिब्रू। यह शब्द मुलत: मिस्र की भाषा के एपिरू शब्द से बना है जिसका शाब्दिक अर्थ है-मिस्री समाज के कुछ ऐसे वर्ग जो खास तरह के काम करते थे, पर कालान्तर में यह शब्द उस भाषा के लिए रूढ़ हो गया जिसे अरब वाले इब्रानी कहते थे। इस भाषा की कतिपय विशेषताएं आरमाइक और अरबी भाषा से मिलती-जुलती हैं। यों तो हिब्रू भाषा के लिखित रूप का सबसे प्राचीन उदाहरण अब से लगभग तीन हजार वर्ष पूर्व के इजरायल में मिलता है जो सम्राट डेविड और उसके बेटे सोलोमन के समय का बताया जाता है, पर प्राचीन हिब्रू में लिखी हुई सबसे प्रसिद्ध रचना बाइबिल है।

बाइबिल शब्द का मूल अर्थ यद्यपि पुस्तक है, पर पाठक जानते ही हैं कि अब इस शब्द का प्रयोग यहूदियों और ईसाइयों के उस पवित्र ग्रन्थ के लिए होता है, जो स्वयं अनेक पुस्तकों का संग्रह है। यह तो निश्चित है कि इन पुस्तकों की रचना अलग-अलग समय पर और अलग-अलग लोगों ने की, पर वह कब हुई, और जो बाइबिल आज हमारे सामने है उसमें

एकमत नहीं है। यहीं कारण है कि बाइबिल के विभिन्न संस्करणों में संकलित पुस्तकों की संख्या 66 पुस्तकों भी हैं जो पहले बाइबिल में संकलित की जाती थीं, पर बाद में जिन्हें ईसाई पंथ को मानने वाले विद्वानों ने स्वयं अप्रामाणिक मानकर खारिज कर दिया है। हाँ, यह ऐतिहासिक तथ्य है कि 17वीं शताब्दी के शुरू में (1607 से 1611) इंग्लैण्ड में किंग जेम्स ने बाइबिल का जो अनुवाद अंग्रेजी में 47 अनुवादाकों से कराया और बाद में उसमें कुछ संशोधन कराकर जो संस्करण ऑक्स्नोर्ड ने 1769 में प्रकाशित किया, आज उसे ही लगभग पूरे विश्व में अंग्रेजी का प्रामाणिक संस्करण माना जाता है। बाइबिल के सामान्यतया दो भाग किए जाते हैं-ओल्ड टेस्टामेंट और न्यू टेस्टामेंट। ओल्ड टेस्टामेंट में 39 और न्यू टेस्टामेंट में 27 अर्थात कुल 66 पुस्तकें हैं।

भाषा की दृष्टि से देखें तो ओल्ड टेस्टामेंट की प्रारम्भिक पांच पुस्तकों हिब्रू में लिखी हुई थीं जिन्हें पेट-ट्यूक अथवा तोरा कहा जाता है। ओल्ड टेस्टामेंट की शेष पुस्तकों लैटिन में और न्यू टेस्टामेंट की सभी पुस्तकें ग्रीक में लिखी हुई थी। पेंटा-ट्यूक के बारे में ऐसा माना जाता है कि ईसा से लगभग पांच शताब्दी पूर्व इन्हें बाइबिल में शामिल किया गया जबकि इनकी रचना काफी पहले, लगभग नौ शताब्दी ईसा पूर्व हो गई थी। इस प्रकार हिब्रू भाषा बाइबिल में तो सुरक्षित हो गई, पर बाद में कई कारणों से वह सामाजिक जीवन से गायब होती चली गई। इनमें सबसे प्रमुख कारण था राजनीतिक। उस समय फारस (वर्तमान ईरान) साम्राज्य का विस्तार होता जा रहा था। ईसा पूर्व छठी शताब्दी में तो ईरानी आर्य सम्राट क्रूश(साइरस) का शासन मध्य एशिया से लेकर भूमध्य सागर तक फैल चुका था।(आर्य भट्ट शब्द से चौंकें नहीं, ईरान भी अतीत में वेद, वैदिक साहित्य और वैदिक परम्पराओं से अनुप्राणित रहा है और ईरान ईरान में इस्लाम मजहब फैल गया तब भी शासकों की गया(कुछ वैसे ही जैसे भारत में लोग पिछली कुछ भूल चुके हैं, उसमें संवाद कैसे कर सकते हैं।

लिए मजबूत हो रहे हैं)। इससे हिब्रु पृष्ठभूमि में चली गई।

हिब्रू को एक और जबरदस्त झटका तब लगा जब ईसा वर्ष 586 बेबीलोन क

शासक नाबुचाडनजर ने यरूशलम पर कब्जा कर लिया और यहूदियों पर तरह-तरह के अत्याचार किए। अत: यहुदियों को अपना वतन छोडकर विश्व के अन्य भागों में पलायन करना पड़ा। इसे ही डायस्पोरा कहा जाता है। बाद में ईसा के जन्म के 70 वर्ष बाद यरूशलम के नष्ट हो जाने पर तो बचे-खुचे यहूदी भी वहां से अन्यत्र जाने के लिए मजबूर हो गए। इस सबका परिणाम यह हुआ कि सैकड़ों वर्षों तक मेसिपोटामिया के यहूदियों की बोलचाल की भाषा आरमाइक ही बनी रही। जो यहुदी मध्य पूर्व में जा बसे थे, उन्होंने अरबी को अपना लिया। इस प्रकार वे जिस देश में गए, उसी देश की भाषा को अपनाते चले गए। अत: हिब्रू भाषा विस्मृति के गर्त में समाती चली

आधुनिक युग में जिस व्यक्ति के मन में इस भूली-बिसरी हिब्रू भाषा को पुन: जीवित करने की इच्छा जागी, उसका नाम था-एलिजर बेन यहूदा। उसका जन्म 1858 में एक सामान्य परिवार में लिथुवानिया(रूस) के एक गांव में हुआ था। रूस में तब जार का शासन था, यहूदी उसमें खुद को अपेक्षित अनुभव करते थे। अतः यहूदियों की अस्मिता को सम्मान दिलाने के लिए एक राष्ट्रव्यापी आन्दोलन शुरू हुआ और बेन यहूदा भी उस आन्दोलन से जुड़ गया। अपने जीवट, न्याय के लिए संघर्ष करने की के शासक आर्य सम्राट ही कहलाते थे। बाद में, जब उत्कट भावना और यहूदियों के सम्मान को सर्वोपरि मानने के कारण, वह शीघ्र ही उस आन्दोलन का यह उपाधि आर्य मेहर के रूप में बरकरार रहीं। हाँ, प्रमुख कार्यकर्ता बन गया। इन्हीं दिनों उसके मन में अब लगभग तीस वर्ष पूर्व हुई इस्लामी क्रांति के बाद अपनी मूल भाषा हिब्रू के प्रति विशेष प्रेम जागा, यह परम्परा समाप्त हो गई है।) हम बात कर रहे थे बाइबिल में तो हिब्रू सुरक्षित थी ही और इसलिए ईरानी साम्राज्य की। क्रूश के पुत्र कम्बीसस और सिनेगाग(यहूदी प्रार्थना भवन) में उसका प्रयोग होता उसके बाद दारा(डेरियस) ने साम्राज्य का विस्तार ही था। बेन यहूदा ने हिब्रू को यहूदियों के आपसी करके मिस्न, थ्रास(वर्तमान बुल्गारिया), मेरिडोनिया संवाद की भाषा बनाने का विचार लोगों के सामने आदि स्थानों को भी जीत लिया। इस साम्राज्य में रहने रखा, पर शुरू में लोगों ने उसके इस विचार का वाले यहूदियों को आरमाइक भाषा( जो बेबीलोन में उपहास उड़ाया और कुछ लोगों ने तो उसे पागल तक बोली जाती थी) अपनाने के लिए विवश किया कह दिया। उन्हें लगता था कि यहूदी जिस भाषा को

यहूदी तो अब न उसका अर्थ समझते थे और न स्वभाषा प्रेम जागा। अब वे उसके आंदोलन से उसका ठीक से उच्चारण कर सकते थे, तो फिर धीरे-धीरे जुड़ने लगे। हिब्रू भाषा को जीवित करने के उसके प्रयोग की बात कैसे सोच सकते थे? स्थिति लिए उसने दिसम्बर 1890 में हिब्रू लैंगुएज काउन्सिल कछ-कछ वैसी ही थी जैसी आज हमारे समाज में बनाई पर बाद में कार्य की गुरूता का अहसास होने अंग्रेजी माध्यम से शिक्षा पाने वाले बच्चों की संस्कृत पर उसे अकेडमी का रूप दिया, तब जाकर उसका के संदर्भ में होती जा रही है।

बेन यहूदा इन आलोचनाओं और प्रतिक्रियाओं से प्रारम्भ में बेन यहूदा ने बाइबिल वाली प्राचीन हिब्नू को संस्कार दिए जा सकते हैं और हर बाधा को पार किया हताश नहीं हुआ, बल्कि इन आलोचनाओं ने उसकी इच्छा को दढ संकल्प का रूप दे दिया जिसे साकार करने के लिए उसने जो प्रयास किए उन्हें अपनी सुविधा के लिए हम तीन वर्गों में बांट सकते है -(1) घर में हिब्रू का प्रयोग (2) शिक्षा के माध्यम के रूप में हिब्रू का प्रयोग(3) विभिन्न आवश्यकताओं के लिए हिब्रू में नए शब्दों का निर्माण।

घर में हिब्रू के प्रयोग की शुरूआत उसने अपने घर से ही की, और इसे इतना विस्तार दे दिया कि जब भी वह किसी यहूदी से घर में या बाहर मिलता तो वार्तालाप में हिब्रू का ही प्रयोग करने का प्रयास करता। अपने इन प्रयासों के प्रति वह कितना गंभीर था, इसका अनुमान इन तथ्यों से लगाया जा सकता है कि जब उसके पहले बच्चे(बेटे) का जन्म हो चुका था और घर में कोई ऐसा व्यक्ति आता जो हिब्रू नहीं बोलता था, तो वह अपने बच्चे को दूसरे कमरे में भेज देता था ताकि बच्चे के कान में दूसरी भाषा का कोई शब्द तक न पड़े। उसकी (पहली) पत्नी रूस की थी और एक दिन जब यहूदा घर पर नहीं था, वह बच्चे को सुलाने के लिए लोरी गाने लगी। अपनी ममता में उसे ध्यान ही नहीं रहा कि लोरी रूसी भाषा में है। संयोग से तभी बेन यहूदा घर में प्रविष्ट हुआ और इसके बाद घर में जो हंगामा हुआ, उसका विवरण उसी बेटे ने अपनी आत्मकथा में दिया है।

स्कुल में हिब्रू के माध्यम से शिक्षा देने की कठिनाइयां और भी अधिक थीं। एक ओर तो हिब्रू में वर्तमान युग की आवश्यकताओं के अनुरूप शब्दों का अभाव था, तो दूसरी ओर ऐसे लोगों का अभाव था जो हिब्रू माध्यम से शिक्षा देने की जिम्मेदारी निभा सकें। बेन यहुदा ने शब्द निर्माता, शब्दकोश निर्माता, शिक्षक, नेता सभी प्रकार की भूमिकाएं निभाई। उसने आइसक्रीम, जेली, आमलेट, रूमाल, तौलिया, गुडिया, साइकिल, समाचार पत्र, सम्पादक, सैनिक आदि के लिए हिब्रू में शब्द बनाए। अपने बनाए शब्द वह अपने समाचार पत्र, हत्न्वी में भी छापता था। यह सर्वज्ञात है कि यहूदी लोग सामान्यतया पढ़ने में रूचिशील होते हैं। अत: उसके प्रयासों की जानकारी केवल फिलिस्तीन में नहीं, विश्व में यहदी जहां भी थे, वहां तक पहुंच गई।

उसकी निष्ठा रंग लाई। उसके संकल्प के आगे

बाइबिल के जिस अंश में हिब्रू सुरक्षित थी, सामान्य अन्यमनस्क और उदासीन लोगों के मन में भी संबंधित साहित्य की रचना हिब्रू में करना गौरव की स्वप्न साकार होता दिखाई देने लगा।

> ही पुनर्जीवित करने की कोशिश की थी, पर डायस्पोरा के बाद से यहदी काफी लम्बे समय से विभिन्न स्थानों पर रह रहे थे, और उन्हीं स्थानों की भाषाओं का प्रयोग करते आ रहे थे, अत: उन्हीं का संकल्प लेना है। अपने स्वभाषा प्रेम और भाषाओं के अभ्यासी बन चुके थे। ऐसी स्थिति में बेन यहुदा ने भी आधुनिक हिब्रू का जो रूप विकसित किया, उसमें रूसी, अरबी, अंग्रेजी आदि के भी अनेक शब्द एवं अन्य विशेषताएं आ गईं। बेन यहदा अपने समाचार पत्र में जो शब्द प्रकाशित करता रहा था, बाद में उन्हें संकलित करके तथा अन्य भी अनेक शब्द बनाकर उसने एक विशाल शब्दकोश कम्प्लीट डिक्शनरी ऑफ ऐन्शिएंट एंड मॉडर्न हिब्रू तैयार किया जो 12 खण्डों में हैं, पर इस कोश्शि का काम उसके जीवन काल में पूरा नहीं हो पाया। इसे उसके देहांत के बाद उसकी दूसरी पत्नी और बेटे ने पूरा किया। यह शब्दकोश आज भी अद्वितीय माना जाता है। आधुनिक हिब्रू की लिपि भी आरमाइक भाषा की लिपि से ली गई और उसे स्क्वायर नाम दिया गया। इस लिपि को अपनाने का एक विशेष कारण यह था कि पिछले लगभग दो हजार वर्ष से इसी लिपि में हिब्रू भाषा वाले बाइबिल के अंश की नकल उतारी जाती रही थी। वे इसी लिपि में उसे पढते आ रहे थे और इस प्रकार अब यह उनकी लिपि बन चुकी थी।

सन् 1948 में जब इजरायल राष्ट्र का उदय हुआ तो बेन यहदा के संकल्प को एक नया आयाम मिल गया। उसका तो 64 वर्ष की आयु में सन् 1922 में क्षयरोग से निधन हो चुका था, पर उसके सत्प्रयासों से जीवित की गई हिब्रू भाषा इज्रायल की राजभाषा बन गई। जरा ध्यान दीजिए कि इज्रायल को बने लगभग उतना ही समय बीता है जितना हमें स्वतंत्र हुए, पर यह यहूदियों का स्वभाषा प्रेम और स्वाभिमान ही है जिसके बल पर वहां व्यापार, प्रशासन, शिक्षा, ज्ञान, विज्ञान, साहित्य, कला, राजनीति आदि जीवन के प्रत्येक क्षेत्र में हिब्रू का ही प्रयोग हो रहा है। पूरे विश्व में यहदियों की कुल संख्या लगभग एक करोड़ है, जिनमें से लगभग आधे अर्थात 50 लाख इज्रायल में रहते हैं, पर हिब्रू भाषा केवल इजरायल में रहने वाले यह्दियों की नहीं, बल्कि पूरे विश्व में बिखरे सभी यहूदियों की भाषा बन चुकी है। यों तो हर यहूदी आज बह-भाषाभाषी है, पर जीवन के विभिन्न क्षेत्रों से बात समझता है।

यह इस बात की प्रमाण है कि अगर अपनी भाषा के प्रति अनुराग हो, अपनी भाषा को लेकर स्वाभिमान का भाव हो तो ऐसी भाषा को भी जीवित किया जा सकता है जिसे दूसरे लोग मृत समझते हैं। उस भाषा को नया रूप दिया जा सकता है, समाज को नए जा सकता है। क्या हम भी अपनी भाषाओं के लिए इससे कुछ प्रेरणा लेंगे? हमारी भाषाएं तो मृत नहीं, जीवित हैं। हमें तो केवल इन भाषाओं के प्रयोग करने स्वाभिमान को जगाना है। बेन यहुदा का उदाहरण क्या हमारे मन में ऊर्जा का संचार नहीं करता? अपने अन्दर झांकियें और अपनी संकल्प शक्ति का परिचय दीजिए।

#### A Review of The Grievances

### THE TRANSVAAL AND OTHER COLONIES

In the Cape Colony, too, there was some newspaper agitation against Indians, and the treatment to which they were subjected was not free from humiliating features. For example, Indian children could not attend public schools, etc, and Indian travellers could hardly secure accommodation in hotels. But there were no restrictions as to trade and the purchase of land for a long time.


There were reasons for this state of things. As we have already seen, there was a fair proportion of the Malays in the population of the Cape Colony in general and of Cape Town in particular. As the Malays are Musalmans, they soon came in contact with their Indian co-religionists, and consequently with other Indians late on. Moreover, some Indian Musalmans married Malay women.

How could the Government of the Cape Colony legislate against the Malays? The Cape was their motherland, Dutch was their mother tongue, they had been living with the Dutch from the very first and therefore largely imitated them in their ways of life. The Cape Colony, therefore, has been the least affected by colour prejudice.

Again as the Cape Colony was the oldest settlement and the chief centre of culture in South Africa, it produced sober, gentlemanly and large hearted Europeans. In my opinion, there is no place on earth and no race, which is not capable of producing the finest types of humanity, given suitable opportunities and education. It has been my good fortune to come across this class of people in all parts of South Africa. In the Cape Colony, however, the proportion of such persons was very much the larger. Perhaps the best known and the most learned among them is Mr. Merriman, who was a member of the first and subsequent ministries that came in power after the grant of responsible government to the Cape Colony in 1872, was again the Premier in the last ministry when the Union was established in 1910, and was known as



the Gladstone of South Africa. Then there are the Moltenos and the Schreiners. Sir John Molteno was the first Premier of the Colony in 1872. Mr. W. P. Schreiner, was a well-known



advocate, for some time Attorney-General, and later on Premier. His sister, Olive Schreiner, was a gifted lady, popular in South Africa and well known wherever the English language is spoken. Even since she wrote the book she became famous as the authoress of Dreams. Her love for all mankind was unbounded. Love was written in her eyes.

Although she belonged to such a distinguished family and was a learned lady, she was so simple in habits that she cleaned utensils in her house herself. Mr. Merriman, the Moltenos and the Schreiners, had always espoused the cause of the Negroes. Whenever the rights of the Negroes were in danger, they stoutly stood up in their defence. They had kindly feelings for the Indians as well, though they made a distinction between Negroes and Indians. Their argument was that as the Negroes had

been the inhabitants of South Africa long before the European settlers, the latter could not deprive them of their natural rights. But as for the Indians it would not be unfair if laws calculated to remove the danger of their undue competition were enacted. All the same they had a warm corner in their hearts for Indians.

When Gokhale went to South Africa, Mr. Schreiner presided over the Townhall meeting in Cape Town, where he was accorded his first public reception in that country. Mr. Merriman also treated him with great courtesy and expressed his sympathy with the Indian cause. There were other Europeans of the type of Mr. Merriman. I have mentioned these well-known names as typical of their class.

The newspapers in Cape Town, too, were less hostile to Indians than in other parts of South Africa. While it is true that for these reasons there has always been less race hatred in the Cape Colony than in other parts, it is but natural that the anti- Indian feeling which constantly found expression in the other colonies also found its way to the Cape. There too two laws copied from Natal were passed, namely, the Immigration Restriction Act and the Dealers' Licenses Act.

It can be said that the door in South Africa, which was formerly wide open, had thus been almost closed against Indians at the time of the Boer War. In the Transvaal there was no restriction on immigration except the registration fee of three pounds. When Natal and the Cape Colony closed their ports to Indians, they had difficulty in landing on their way to the Transvaal which was in the interior. They could reach it via Delagoa Bay, a Portuguese port. But the a Portuguese also more or less imitated the British. It must be mentioned that some stray Indians were able to find their way to the Transvaal via Natal or Delagoa Bay by suffering great hardships or by bribing port officers.
