Romani Member of Parliament in Spain Proposes Measures for Improving Situation of Romani People

Spanish Parliamentarian of Romani origin Dr. Ismael Cortes has introduced a proposal that seeks a state pact to combat discrimination against Romani people and proposes measures such as improved the access to education, an end to shanty towns, and for adding "antigitanismo" (antigypsyism) to the country's Criminal Code. He hopes that a commission on discrimination and inclusion might be approved as early as this month. Dr. Cortes further said, now more people from the Gitano/Roma community are daring to step into politics and talk about things such as discrimination, representation and antigitanismo.

Silent Scandal: Romani Children in State Care Institutions

The article elaborates on the removal of Romani children from their biological families and being placed in institutional state care even in 21st century. The latest report by the European Roma Rights Centre (ERRC) states that the long-term institutionalization of young children is a form of violence and the disproportionate numbers of Romani children taken into state care amounts to a form of racist violence. Many Romani children are caught in a cruel snare of poverty and racism. Owing to dysfunctional child-protection systems, a large number of Romani kids are being placed in state-run care homes where these vulnerable youngsters become victims of abuse and exploitation.

barriers, lack of identification and proof of residence documents. Another challenge for GRT people would be to submit requisite documents to prove that they meet the necessary residencycriteriabefore the deadline of 30th June 2021

Roma - the Weakest Link in the Fight against the Pandemic

The German Newspaper-Frankfurter AllgemeineZeitung wrote about the difficulties in vaccinating Roma, who live in slums. There are fears that Roma settlements could become a permanent source of infection. Stolipinovo in Plovdiv, Bulgaria, the largest of all Roma slums in Southeast Europe, and home to about 60,000 Roma people, is considered to be a potential point of new outbreaks of virus. The Roma are a relatively young population with "below-average life expectancy", so this may contribute to a mild and imperceptible course of infection.Lack of awareness of the importance of vaccination among Roma peoplehas also been cited as a problem because of limited facilities to reach out to them.

She worked in 47 films like Otò and Cleopatra (Fernando Cerchio, 1963), Perfume of a Woman (Dino Risi, 1974) and her last appearance on the big screen in the film Christmas in India (2003). Miranda Orfei, popularly known as Moira, was born on 21 December 1931 in Codroipo, in the province of Udine and passed away at the age of 83. Moira along with her husband Walter Nones founded their own circus: The Moira Orfei circus, which over time became one of the largest in Europe.

Centre for Roma Studies and Cultural Relations (CRSCR)- Antar Rashtriya Sahayog Parishad (ARSP) is profoundly sad to inform the demise of Prof. Marcel Courthiade in Tirana, Albania, on 4th March, 2021, who was professor at Institut National des Langues et Civilisations Orientales (INALCO) and was a head of the chair of Rromani studies at INALCO Paris-City Sorbonne (department of Southern Asia and Himalaya). He was the commissioner for language and Linguistic Justice of the International Rromani Union. He was a committed scholar, versatile genius, polyglot, linguist, historian, poet, ethnologist and author.

Prof. Courthiade made invaluable contributions to the field of Romani Studies and propounded Kannauj theory with regards to the exodus of Roma from Kannauj in 1018. He was an integral part of the two international Roma conferences organized by ARSP and Indian Council for Cultural Relations, Ministry of External Affairs, Gov. of India in New Delhi in 2016 and 2018. Prof. Courthiade dedicated his life and tirelessly worked for scientifically establishing the historical, spiritual, linguistic and cultural link of Rroma with India and presented Rromani cultural heritage as world heritage.
