From 2010 to 2014, he served as the High Commissioner of India to Fiji, representing not just Fiji but also holding concurrent accreditation to the Cook Islands, Kiribati, Nauru, Tonga, and Tuvalu, while fostering key diplomatic relationships with the Pacific Islands Forum and other regional organizations.

Amb. Kumar's exceptional service extended to his role as Additional Secretary (International Organisations) from 2014 to 2015, before his appointment as Ambassador to Uzbekistan in May 2015.

Sooklal, who is South Africa's first Indian-origin High commissioner to Delhi said, "I'm very blessed because I'm African, in the sense that my Janmabhoomi is Africa, and now my Karmabhoomi is India. So I am a blend of both African and Indian in one package. I'm proud of both identities."

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Visited Guyana from 20-21 November 2024

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's historic tour of Guyana, Barbados, and Grenada included a series of engagements that strengthened bilateral relations and highlighted India's growing connections with the Caribbean region. During his visit to Guyana, PM Modi participated in high-profile meetings, made symbolic gestures, and reached agreements across various key sectors.

Strengthening Bilateral Cooperation

A significant highlight of PM Modi's visit was the signing of 10 to Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs), enhancing ac collaboration in key sectors such as:

- Health and Pharmaceuticals: Establishment of a Jan Ausadhi Kendra in Guyana to expand access to affordable medicines and partnerships to supply affordable medications to CARICOM countries.
- Hydrocarbons: Expanded cooperation covering crude sourcing, natural gas, and infrastructure development.
- Agriculture: Joint initiatives, research and development, and food security efforts, including the donation of millet seeds to bolster Guyana's food security.
- Digital Transformation: Capacity building and the potential deployment of India's UPI-like real-time payment system in Guyana.
- **Defence and Skill Development:** Continued support for skill development, building on the gift of two Dornier aircraft to Guyana earlier this year.

The tour also identified new cooperation avenues, such as: Education and human capital development, Technology transfer, food processing Advancements, Ayurvedic medicine and vaccine manufacturing.

The Labour Party won the Mauritius election, marking a significant political shift

In a stunning political shift, Mauritius' opposition coalition has secured a decisive victory in the country's parliamentary elections, sweeping all 62 contested seats and effectively ending Prime Minister Pravind Jugnauth's tenure. The opposition Alliance for Change, led by former Prime Minister Navin Ramgoolam, will now take control of administrative reforms the island nation's government.

Results released throughout showed that the governing Militant Socialist Movement (MSM) coalition failed to win a single seat, with the opposition securing wins across all 21 constituencies. Prime Minister Jugnauth, who had been in office since 2017, conceded defeat early in the day, acknowledging the overwhelming defeat of government. "The population has decided to choose another team,"

Jugnauth said in a brief statement. "I wish good luck to the country." The MSM's loss follows allegations of corruption involving leaked recordings of politicians and business figures, which had severely damaged the government's credibility.

Ramgoolam, who served as prime minister from 1995 to 2000 and again from 2005 to 2014, is poised to return to power. Official results, including seats from Rodrigues Island, are expected by Tuesday. Mauritius, a stable democracy and growing economy in the Indian Ocean, has held regular elections since its independence in 1968.

Former U.S. President Donald Trump made a strong comeback by winning a second term in office, defeating. Vice. President Kamala Harris, the

In a landmark development, six Indian-origin Americans have been elected to the U.S. Congress following the final phase of the 2024 presidential elections. This diverse group, informally dubbed the "Samosa Caucus," includes five re-elected Congress members: Ami Bera, Raja Krishnamoorthi, Ro Khanna, Pramila Jayapal, and Shri Thanedar. In addition, Suhas Subramanyam, a Democrat from Virginia, will make his debut in Congress. his debut in Congress.

He holds the distinction of being the first South Asian American to lead a Congressional committee.
